This Cooperative Grocery Store Wants to Break the Diversity Mold

The Seward Community Co-op in Minneapolis built its new food co-op store as a reflection of its community with the mission and business model of people of color.

As a Black woman who grew up in Minneapolis, there's a well-worn expression I hear from others: the *Seward Community Co-op* (aka *Food Co-op*) store is the perfect place. 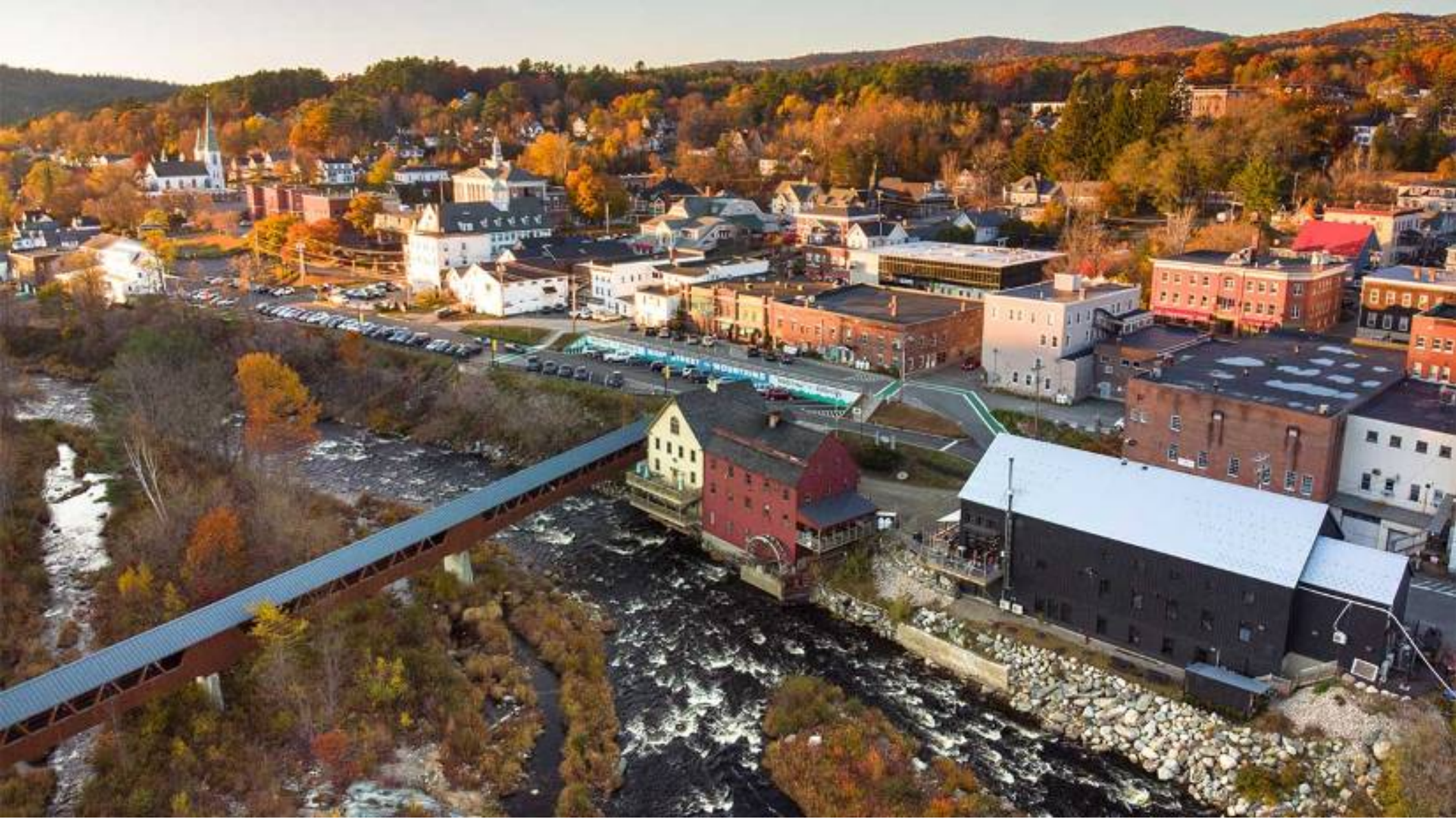

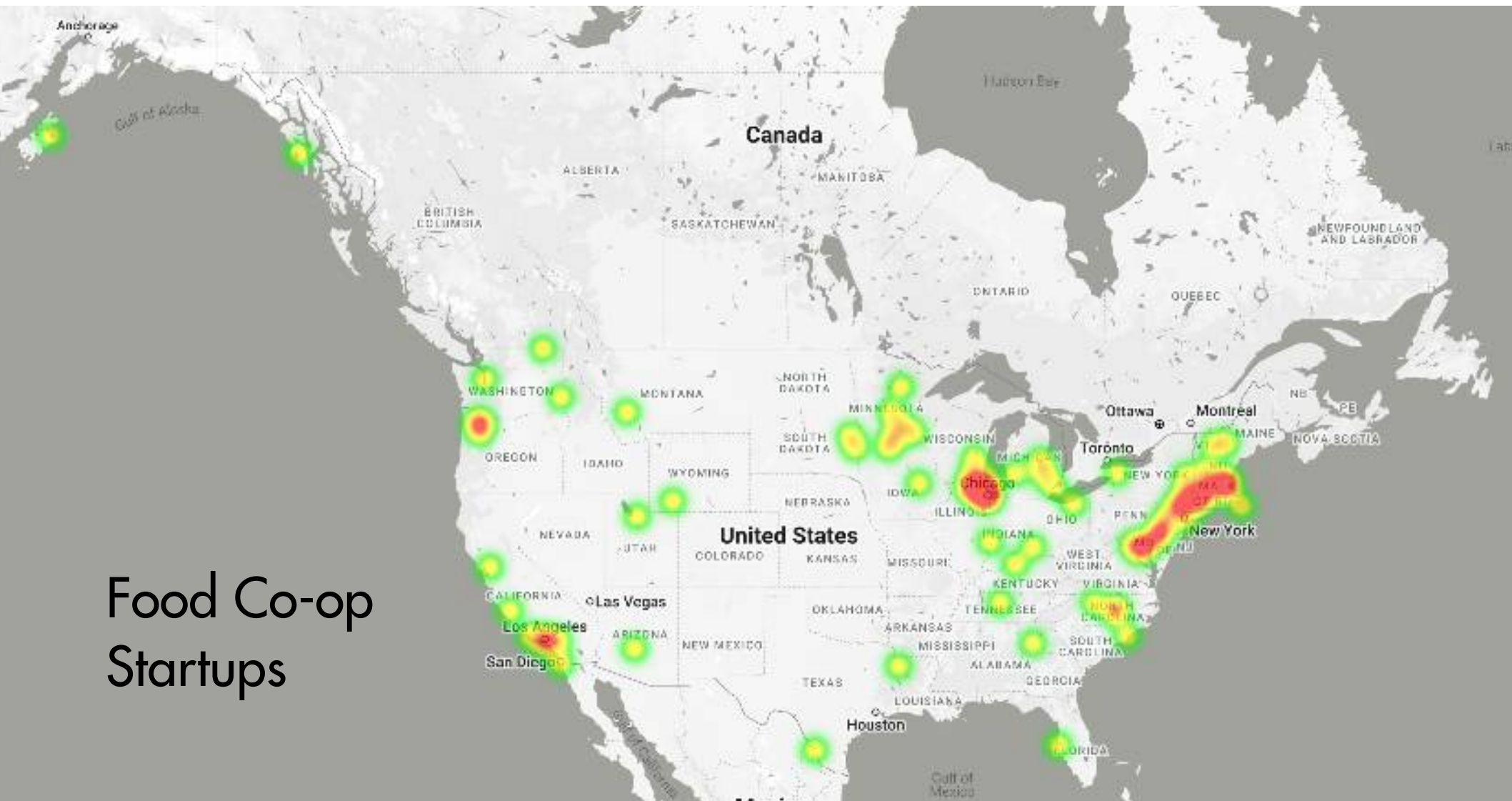
